### Rule: -

1. The first topper will be the overall topper among students moving to classes 11th, 12th, and those taking a gap year (dropper).
2. The second topper will be the runner-up among students moving to classes 11th, 12th, and those taking a gap year (dropper).
3. The overall topper among students coming from classes 9th and 10th will be awarded third place.
4. The fourth and fifth positions will be occupied by the overall toppers from all classes, excluding those who secured the top three ranks.
5. The subsequent positions, from sixth to tenth, will be filled by the next highest achievers from each class, excluding those who have already secured one of the top five positions.
6. The eleventh to twentieth positions will be filled by the next two highest achievers from each class, considering a combined score for JEE and NEET for students in classes 11th and 12th, as well as those in the dropper category
